**Town Council Meeting**

Board Members present: Sid Holderly, Maureen Buschman, and Veronica Favela. Jerry Robertson and Mike Ransone were absent.

Other community members present: Deputy Clerk, Carol Hendress, Town Superintendent, Bob Hall, Attorney, Cliff Robinson, Marshal, Wayne Winkler, Engineer, Ken Smith, Pete Tetzloff, Sharon Brooks, Allison Dilling, Joe Bilyeu, Kim Wells, Stacy & Jaylen Morgan, Steve Hintz, Lightstream representatives Stan Bennett and Jeremy

6:30PM EST, Town Council President, Sid Holderly called the Town Council meeting to order. Sid led the pledge of allegiance and asked all in attendance to silence their phones.

A motion to accept the agenda as presented was made with a second to the motion and the motion carried.

A motion was made to accept the June 9, 2026 minutes as presented. A second to the motion was made and the motion carried.

A motion was made to accept the June expenditures. A second to the motion was made and the motion carried.

Old Business – Ordinance #2026-07-14.1 – Permitting of Private Water Well was read. After reading, a motion to accept the ordinance as presented was made with a second to the motion. The motion carried with two yays and one nay by Veronica Favela

Sharon Brooks gave an update on the new park. The township has been awarded an \$85,000 grant for continued growth of the park. The new solar farm going in north of town has spoke of interest in providing the pavilion and there are extra sets of bleachers that the board made a motion to accept bids and try to sell them. A second to the motion was made and the motion carried.

New Business – Lightstream representatives were in attendance asking for permission to install a third fiber optic line in the town right of way. After clarification on the two locations (S Main St on the N side of Bill Dahlenburg driveway and at the N end of German and US 24) a motion was made to allow the third line to be installed pending the county permitting process. A second to the motion was made and the motion carried.

Town Engineer and Town Superintendent, Bob Hall presented the proposed plans for the new water treatment plant. The town has received award notification of the SRF loan for this project and things will start to happen quickly. A motion was made to accept the proposed plans as presented with a second to the motion and the motion carried.

Resident, Steve Hintz voiced several concerns and threats made to him by the Town Marshal. He stated that he had contacted his attorney, White County Prosecutor, White County Sheriff, State Police Investigative Unit, State Board of Accounts, State Attorney General, State Inspector General, Ethic Commission, and IRS. He requested a Special Prosecutor and Judge due to a conflict of interest. Only two of the concerns pertained to Steve himself. The others were voiced on behalf of other business owners, land owners, etc. None of which have expressed concerns to the town for themselves.

Bob Hall, Town Superintendent – Bob went over his written report that all council members received. Bob thanked Jaylen Morgan for his help with traffic control on the evening of the water main break. New traffic count charts were presented. Bob received a scholarship to pay for his registration and hotel at the Midwest Damage Prevention Training Conference. Bob also asked for the council's blessing to bring Pat Beamon in for \$500 to lay out a clear understanding of where we currently are and what needs to be improved. This expense is within his cost jurisdiction. A motion was made that anytime Bob needs assistance with emergency situations, he has the right to pay them at current part-time wage. A second to the motion was made and the motion carried.

Clifford Robinson, Town Attorney – Recommended to the council that they adopt an all-inclusive penalty ordinance that states what is in the newly adopted private water well ordinance. Working with Ken with legal fees and getting the bond ordinance ready.

Ken Smith, Town Engineer – Just wanted to thank Bob and Joe for all their help in their long hours of trying to produce good clean water.

Wayne Winkler, Marshal – Presented the Reserve hours in the last month along with other stats. He is doing a Lemonade Stand at the fair with all proceeds going to Isaiah House 117 in Lafayette. This house is for children removed from their homes for safety reasons.

Pam Cochran, Town Clerk – Not in attendance. She is at ILMTC in Michigan City

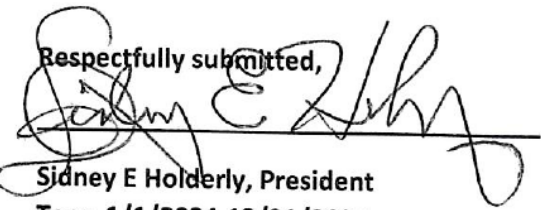

Maureen Buschman, Economic Development – She was unable to attend the July Economic Development luncheon, therefore has nothing to report.

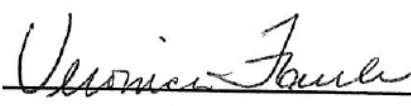
Hearing nothing further, a motion to adjourn was made with a second to the motion and the motion carried.

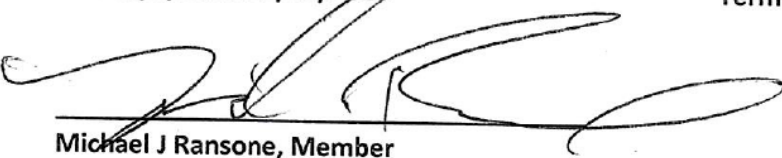
